

We nurture long-term relationships with every individual of the Hope Alive! family. Students, mentors, staff, and families are known, loved, and cared for; they are not numbers.


LOCAL

HOPE ALIVE! APPROACH

Loss of parents, neglect, insufficient income, and significantly limited access to education and vocational training—these are among the harsh realities that perpetuate generational poverty in Uganda. These challenges also deeply touch the hearts of many people worldwide who desire to see justice for the oppressed and hope for the marginalized. “Doing good” is not always as easy as it sounds; over more than 20 years of ministry in Uganda, we have developed a set of principles to help guide our efforts and, by God’s grace, bring justice, hope, and healing to a very broken world.

Below are several of these foundational principles that undergird our ministry, as well as some of the outcomes we are seeing today (at least partially) as a result of our principles and approach to ministry.


Foundational Principles

- The local church is indispensable to creating strong families and communities
- Parents (or other caretakers) are primary
- The family is the best place for a child to grow
- Students are present and future leaders
- Education is a fundamental human right
- Families and communities are stronger when they work together
- Jesus Christ is our ultimate hope

Significant Outcomes

- Parents, students, and whole families putting their hope in Jesus
- Parents and communities coming together to create economic opportunities
- Families growing and staying together
- Alumni becoming people of influence in their communities
- Students who are the “firsts” to read, marry, graduate, and be employed

By God’s grace, we are witnessing families breaking free from poverty as well as alumni becoming leaders in their families, churches, and communities. KEY AREAS OF IMPACT

EXPANDING OPPORTUNITIES FOR EDUCATION

HOPE ALIVE! MOBILE LIBRARY PROJECT UPDATE

Fostering Literacy Across Gulu

In Uganda, 60% of schools do not have a functional library, and only 1% of children 10 years old and younger live in a household where children's books are present. With those statistics in our minds and with our students in our hearts, we set out to ensure that Hope Alive! students had access to books in their homes, at their schools, and at our ministry sites.

In 2023, we opened libraries at three of our sites and gifted students personal books at Christmastime. In 2024, we took on the challenge of getting books into the schools that Hope Alive! students attend.

Thanks to a few very generous donations, Hope Alive! was able to launch the Mobile Library Program (MLP) in four partner schools in Northern Uganda in 2024. The MLP provides a rotating stock of age-appropriate books as well as improved literacy instruction for all of the teachers and students in those schools.

In 2023, 114 Hope Alive! students benefitted from a new lending library at our Koro (Gulu) site.

In 2024, 2,795 students, including both Hope Alive! students and their peers at four primary schools, now have regular access to quality books and improved literacy instruction.



BENEFITS FOR STUDENTS

- **Improved Literacy:** Students displayed enhanced reading skills, confidence in reading aloud, and better comprehension
- **Language Development:** Students made significant progress in their English speaking and interpretation abilities
- **Cultural Shift:** Reading is becoming a daily habit and a source of enjoyment for students
- **Engagement with Stories:** Storybooks have helped students develop cognitive skills like story retelling and critical thinking



IMPACTS FOR TEACHERS

- **Access to Resources:** The project provided much-needed books and materials for school libraries
- **Effective Teaching:** Teachers were empowered with strategies to teach reading more effectively
- **Classroom Management:** Independent reading sessions improved focus and discipline in classrooms
- **Community Connection:** The project fostered stronger partnerships between Hope Alive! and the schools



EDUCATION IN UGANDA





BUILDING FUTURES TOGETHER

How Caregivers in Koro Are Empowered Through Savings Groups



We are stronger when we work together. Today, many Hope Alive! families and communities are experiencing this powerful truth through our Savings and Loan groups. These groups provide a safe and secure informal banking system for families who are unable to access traditional banks. Participants can regularly save, earn interest, and issue low-risk loans to one another. One mom says, "I didn't know that I had anything to save until I joined this group! Now I'm saving every week and building a better future for my family!"

TRANSFORMATION IN COMMUNITY

Faith Over Fear

Every week in Northern Uganda, a group of mentors, staff, and caregivers organize a community worship service at different homes. While the location changes, the message remains the same:

Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved.

One week, the group was invited to hold the gathering at the home of a community member who had been shunned due to her involvement in witchcraft—a dark and deeply rooted reality in Uganda. Though some were wary, the group accepted the invitation, and neighbors were welcomed. The meeting began with singing, teaching, and sharing.

When it was time to eat—a meal traditionally prepared by the host—the atmosphere changed. The attendees, usually eager to eat, appeared hesitant. In truth, everyone was hungry, but fear of being poisoned or bewitched through the food held the crowd back.

Sensing the tension, a Hope Alive! staff member stood up, took a plate of food, and began to eat without hesitation.

That act broke the fear in the room, and soon, everyone else joined in.



That day, the gospel was not only shared in word but also demonstrated in action—and it left a lasting impact! Two of the hostess' children professed faith in Jesus, and while the hostess herself has yet to declare Jesus as Lord, the community has witnessed a remarkable change in her demeanor. Walls of skepticism and fear have started to crumble, creating space for the hope of Christ to shine in her life and the lives of those around her.

FARMING GOD'S WAY

Transforming Agriculture, One Field at a Time

In Uganda, agriculture is the primary means of survival for many families. Yet, most struggle to make a sustainable income due to traditional farming practices that deplete the soil and limit yields among a variety of other factors. Recognizing this challenge, Hope Alive! has been working to introduce families to improved agricultural methods, including an approach known as Farming God's Way (FGW).

Since 2019, Hope Alive! has been experimenting with FGW at its demonstration farm in Gulu. By planting a half acre of corn and a half acre using traditional methods, the team has been able to directly compare the outcomes. The results have been remarkable.



In September, the team harvested and processed the cornfields planted in April, discovering that FGW significantly outperformed traditional farming. While the traditional method yielded 408 pounds of corn, FGW produced a shocking 1,407 pounds—the largest harvest in Hope Alive!'s history. This bounty, seen drying in the chicken house-turned-storage facility, serves as a powerful testimony to the effectiveness of the method and a step towards the goal of seeing families live more sustainably off of their land.

HELPING WITHOUT HURTING

Transforming Hearts and Communities

How do we help people with genuine needs without creating dependency? How do we "teach to fish" instead of simply "handing out fish"? These questions have been central to Hope Alive!'s work, and in 2024, we were deeply blessed to receive training that brought fresh insight and clarity to these challenges.

In October 2024, the Hope Alive! team gathered in Koro (Gulu) for a transformative five-day training called "Helping Without Hurting in Africa." Rooted in a holistic approach to poverty alleviation, the training combined biblical principles with practical tools for fostering sustainable development and empowering communities.

This impactful training encouraged our mentors, staff, and participants to adopt a renewed mindset toward poverty and wealth. For example, Mentor Amos gained a profound sense of value in the resources already available to him. Living on a small piece of land, Amos began cultivating green peppers in a nursery bed, inspired by the training's emphasis on starting small and growing assets over time. With this foundation, Amos now envisions building a thriving business during the dry season.

Many mentors shared that they no longer define themselves as poor but instead recognize their wealth in land, food crops, trees, and the labor and support of their families. "Having little money doesn't determine our poverty," they affirmed.

Together, we are renewing mindsets, refining practices, and working towards sustainable transformation!



EMPOWERING MEN THROUGH FAITH AND BUSINESS

The Man Up and Go Program

The Man Up and Go program equips men to thrive as fathers, husbands, and leaders in their communities. Absentee fatherism and pervasive alcoholism have left many young men with few older men to look up to and learn from. With the consistent presence of male mentors and the Man Up and Go program, we are hopeful that the next generation of men in Uganda will grow into loving husbands, caring fathers, and servant leaders of their communities. A similar program for young women is being developed in Kampala, Masaka, and Koro (Gulu).

The program begins with 12 weeks of discipleship training, guiding men to live with integrity and actively serve their families and communities. Following this, they receive 10 weeks of business training providing skills in entrepreneurship, marketing, and budgeting. Many graduates have successfully applied for microloans of up to \$500, turning their skills into tangible opportunities.

In the Koro (Gulu) community, 65 men have completed the program, launching ventures such as plumbing shops, tree nurseries, general stores, and agro-vet businesses. These men have demonstrated resilience and stewardship, using their training to support their families and address community needs.



ODONG WALTER

owned a small plumbing shop in Gulu. With a microloan, he expanded his inventory to include high-demand items like sinks and toilets, increasing both profitability and customer satisfaction.



OKELLO SUNDAY

established a tree nursery, growing fruit trees for nourishment and timber seedlings for income, reflecting his vision for sustainability.

OJOK FRANCIS

opened a shop at a remote trading center, meeting market gaps and providing essential goods to the local community.



OKELLO FRANCIS

started a piggery, which later transitioned into an agro-vet shop offering fertilizers and animal medicines. With profits from his farming efforts, he repaid his loan and is now looking to expand.

STORIES OF IMPACT



THE RIPPLE EFFECT

Two sisters' lives were transformed through Hope Alive!'s holistic care. The younger sister had been struggling with an illness for over a month, unable to eat or interact with anyone. Her family watched helplessly, unsure of how to help. After being referred to a specialized clinic, she was diagnosed with tuberculosis and tested positive for HIV. With treatment, counseling and ongoing care for her medical conditions facilitated by her site manager, Beatrice Nanyunga, the girl recovered and is now thriving—eating well, being active, and joyfully playing. Her grateful father said, "Hope Alive! You are an angel that God sent to save my family."

But the story doesn't end there. The elder sister, Maya, who is not enrolled in Hope Alive!, had also been deeply affected by her family's struggles. After their mother's death, Maya's education came to an abrupt halt because her father could not afford to send her to secondary school. As her friends continued their studies, Maya's hope began to fade. Through Hope Alive!'s counseling and support, she found a renewed sense of purpose. A community caregiver, who had received a tailoring machine through Hope Alive!'s loan and savings group, agreed to mentor her. Maya has learned valuable sewing skills, and recently, she proudly showed off a dress she had made, saying, "Aunt (Site Manager) Beatrice, this was all because of you. When you came to our family, everything changed. Today, my life has meaning."



Inspired by Maya's transformation, her father was moved to make arrangements for his other children to return to school. This family's testimony emphasizes the ripple effect of Hope Alive!'s work, demonstrating how the sponsorship of one child can profoundly impact the whole family.

A MODEST GIFT TURNED INTO AN ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY



Juliet is a 37-year-old disabled widow with four children. Although she dreamed of all of her children going to school, and someday even graduating from university, she had no way of earning a living in order to pay for the cost of their education. Her disability left her unable to walk or to find regular employment. Undeterred and more than a bit desperate, Juliet would crawl from one place to another to gather clothes, wash them by hand in a small basin, and earn just enough money to put food on the table and pay for rent. The family was struggling, wondering how things would change for them.

Seeing the desperate need of the family, Hope Alive! enrolled one of the boys, Elijah, in 2021. That Christmas, Elijah's sponsor sent him a \$50 Christmas gift. Through the guidance of Hope Alive! staff, Juliet, or "Mama Elijah," used some of the money to buy a piglet, which the family raised and sold for a profit. They then purchased a knitting machine, which Juliet immediately put to work making sweaters—she already knew how to knit! In a few short months, Mama Elijah had made enough money to send her three remaining children to school with the profit from selling her sweaters to nearby schools and people in her community.

Soon after, Hope Alive! staff connected Mama Elijah with a local church, and through Hope Alive!'s networking, she received a wheelchair, greatly improving her mobility.

She said, "Thank you, Hope Alive! It's through you that I managed to get my starting capital for my business and now am able to pay school fees for my other three children. I am starting to see my dream of being able to educate all of my children come true."

Through the sponsorship of one child, an entire family's future was transformed. We praise God for the way He multiplies hope!

TRANSFORMING LIVES THROUGH LITERACY

One of the most exciting milestones of 2024 has been witnessing the power of literacy in the lives of our students. In 2023, thanks to the generosity of our supporters, every Hope Alive! student received three books at Christmas—many for the first time in their lives. These books have not only opened the door to knowledge but have also become tools for personal growth, empowerment, and hope.

Throughout the year, our students have been immersing themselves in their books and regularly visiting our libraries to sharpen their reading skills. The results have been remarkable, and we're proud to share some of their stories



Benitah

From Illiteracy to Inspiration

When Benitah joined Hope Alive! in P2, she couldn't read or write—not even her own name. However, through remedial lessons, Benitah not only gained literacy skills but also discovered a passion for learning. At a Saturday Club devotion, she shared, "Praise God! I didn't know how to read or write. But now, I can read and understand my Bible, and my class performance has improved. I enjoy reading! Thank you, Hope Alive!"



Nathan

Finding His Voice Through Reading

Nathan once struggled with shyness, especially when speaking in public. However, the books he received have become a turning point in his life. By reading and re-reading his books with his family, Nathan's English has improved significantly, strengthening his vocabulary and broadening his understanding of different cultures.



This newfound confidence has shaped Nathan into a leader among his peers. He is now the first to volunteer to read scripture aloud during Saturday Club devotions!

Rita

Choosing a Better Path Through Literacy

For Rita, books have been a lifeline, helping her steer clear of negative influences and make good choices. She cherishes the books she now owns, reading them as often as she can, whether at school or home. Her dedication to reading has increased her critical thinking and vocabulary, and her spoken English has significantly improved. Rita's enthusiasm is evident; she encourages her friends to visit the site library every weekend!



Perfect

Discovering Confidence and Joy in Learning

Perfect used to feel burdened by the expectation to live up to her name, but everything changed when she read "Be a Perfect Person in Just Three Days!" This humorous book taught her that only God is perfect and boosted her self-esteem. She now has a new outlook on performance and resting in God.



Perfect's love for reading has since flourished. She has taken on the role of acting librarian at her Hope Alive! site, where she assists her peers in finding books, keeps records of checkouts, and ensures students are making the most of their reading time.

MENTORSHIP IN ACTION

Hope Alive! mentors walk alongside students and their families, providing holistic guidance, emotional support, and practical tools for transformation.

Emily describes her time with Hope Alive! as "a great blessing". Through Bible studies and meaningful conversations with her mentors, Emily has not only grown in her knowledge of God but also has developed a deep desire for the Lord. "My questions on passages I don't understand well in the Bible are always answered by our mentors. I thank them for their willingness to listen and respond to me," she shared. Now in her first year of university, Emily confidently participates in class discussions, a skill she attributes to her mentors' encouragement and support.



For Chosen, mentorship brought healing and transformation to her family. This year, her mother, Annet, opened up about past mistakes, sought forgiveness, and committed to live a godly life. Influenced by Hope Alive!'s discipleship programs, this act of courage has restored trust in their relationship. God is on the move!

The ripple effect continues to grow. Mary Tushabe, a Hope Alive! alumna and current mentor, started a girls' club to help others face struggles like low self-esteem (see next page). "I wanted to create a safe space where girls can share, seek support, and build confidence as daughters of the King," she said.

Mentorship has the power to shape lives, facilitate healing, and develop skills. That's why it is at the core of Hope Alive!'s ministry.

EMPOWERING GIRLS THROUGH MENTORSHIP

The Story of Girls With Value

Hope Alive! alumna and mentor Mary Tushabe founded the Girls With Value Club at the Masaka site to provide specialized mentorship for older girls. The club has become a space where girls ages 12 and above can share their struggles, find community, and grow in their identity in Christ.

The club meets during school breaks and creates an environment where members discuss personal challenges, such as feeling unloved or struggling to make friends. Through Bible study and heartfelt conversations, Mary reminds the girls of their inherent worth and value in Jesus. Mary's mentorship has fostered a beautiful sisterhood of encouragement and growth. The Girls With Value Club is just one example of how mentorship is equipping young women to overcome challenges, embrace their God-given worth, and invest in the lives of others. We are deeply grateful for the leadership of women like Mary, who are raising up the next generation of confident, secure young women.



A PRAYER COME TRUE

Grandmother Toepista's Story of Hope

"Watching my grandchildren grow into responsible young men and women is a prayer come true," said Grandma Toepista, as she reflected on the impactful investment of Hope Alive! in her grandchildren's lives.

After the loss of her daughter, Andrew and Joseph's mother, Toepista was left shattered. "She supported me and the children, but after her death, I had no hope for my grandchildren because I couldn't support myself," she recalled.

In 2012, Andrew and Joseph joined Hope Alive!, marking a journey of life change. With the support of sponsors and mentors, they received education, emotional care, and spiritual guidance. Joseph has since finished school, and Andrew is pursuing a diploma in veterinary medicine—a source of immense pride for Toepista. "Who knew my grandchildren would become like this if not for God?" she exclaimed.

Grateful for the Hope Alive! community, Toepista said, "Thank you for changing my grandchildren's lives. Your support has been a true blessing." These words of testimony highlight the tangible impact of education and deep, meaningful relationships fostered through Hope Alive!

WALKING TOGETHER

Bridging the Distance for Hope and Education



This year, we launched our first-ever “Walk in Their Shoes” 5.1K event, and what a journey it was! Inspired by the daily walk of Hope Alive! students—many of whom travel up to 5.1 kilometers to and from school—we invited our supporters to step into their shoes for a meaningful cause.

Participants from all over laced up their sneakers, walked their neighborhoods, and shared stories of resilience and determination. Through their efforts, we raised over \$8,000 to support students in Uganda!

The funds raised will help provide vital resources like educational materials, mentorship programs, and transportation assistance—ensuring that every student has the tools they need to succeed.

One participant shared, “It was humbling to walk a distance these kids travel daily for their education. It reminded me of how much I take for granted and how meaningful it is to make a small sacrifice for such a big impact.”

We’re incredibly grateful to everyone who joined the walk, donated, and shared this effort with their friends and family. Your steps have made a real difference in the lives of Hope Alive! students, and we look forward to walking together again next year as we build on this success.



GIVING TUESDAY

Lighting the Way to a Brighter Future

In many parts of Uganda, when the sun goes down, studying becomes nearly impossible for students at home. No electricity means they're stuck with dim or unsafe light sources—or no light at all. This makes it incredibly difficult for them to keep up with their studies and perform well in school.

That's why, in 2024, we launched a project to bring light—and hope—into their homes. Thanks to the generosity of our supporters, we raised over \$14,000 to provide portable solar lights for these students!


These lights give students the chance to focus on their education and reach their God-given potential. The lights also make homes safer and open up new economic opportunities for entire families.


2024 STUDENT ENROLLMENT




2024 FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Educational expenses increase as a student advances into higher grade levels, but the monthly sponsorship amount remains the same. During the less expensive primary grades, a reserve is accumulated; that reserve will be spent on educational expenses as the student advances into higher (and more expensive) grade levels.



The “Other Reserves” category includes projects where funds were received but had not been spent as of the end of 2024. This includes funding for the ongoing construction in [Koch Lii](#), the most recent [Giving Tuesday](#) fundraising drive in late November to provide solar lights to each student, and other pending ministries.

WHAT'S ON THE HORIZON FOR 2025?

Transforming Lives in Koch Lii in 2025 and Beyond

We are constructing a new ministry site in Koch Lii (pronounced Coach Lee), Uganda, planned to fully open in January, 2026. Koch Lii is a rural county in Northern Uganda, with a population of only 13,000 spread across 850 square kilometers. In an impoverished area, many in Koch Lii struggle to meet their daily needs, and educational opportunities for children are limited and inadequate. Hope Alive! plans to address these needs through a multi-faceted approach.

Church Planting

Hope Alive! is in discussions with the Baptist Union of Uganda and University Christian Church in Gulu to plant a church in Koch Lii. The church will be located on our new site and supported by a U.S. church partner. The Baptist Union will send a pastor and provide formal oversight, while UCC will offer mentoring and guidance.

Hope Alive! Koch Lii Site

Our new site will serve as a hub for ministry in the community. Initially enrolling 50 children from the most fragile families, the site will gradually expand to 150 students. It will host Saturday Clubs, community gatherings, and parent meetings. This site will be a place of hope and transformation for many.

Educational Support

Hope Alive! will collaborate with local schools to improve education quality. We'll provide capacity-building opportunities for teachers and administrators to help strengthen the local educational system. Our successful Mobile Library Program, launched in Koro, will also expand to Koch Lii, ensuring access to books and literacy resources.

Community Development

Hope Alive! will empower families through agricultural training and microloan programs, enabling them to meet their needs sustainably. By providing opportunities for beekeeping and tree planting, as well as safe spaces for savings and investment, we aim to build a more resilient local economy.

PARTNERING FOR CHANGE
